Chairman's Report: Charting a Course for Renewed Success

Dear Valued Stakeholders,

I am pleased to present this report on the Corporation's performance for the second quarter. The recently appointed Management and Board in collaboration have undertaken a process of diligent introspection. We have collectively assessed every facet of the Corporation to ensure a resilient and sustainable future.

Comprehensive Operational Review

Operational excellence has fuelled Management's attention to detail of the Corporation's financial performance. These reviews were not merely exercises in compliance; they were fundamental steps in identifying areas for improvement around the inefficiencies of the operations. This resulted in an impairment of property, plant and equipment inclusive of an inoperable berth and defunct port handling equipment amounting to \$4.7M. Within working capital, increases in bad debt and obsolescence provisions totalling \$6.0M were also recognised.

Our continuing operations for the period achieved a commendable 15% increase in total revenue. This growth was

achieved by increases in containerised cargo of 17% (2025 - 130,985 TEUs vs. 2024 -112,430 TEUs) while general cargo increased by 13% (2025 - 187,903 MTs vs 2024 - 166,443 MTs). Vessel calls also increased by 11% (2025 - 565 Calls vs 2024 - 510 Calls).

Conversely, there was a notable decline in LCL Warehouse operations of 24% (2025-9069 Deliveries vs 2024-11,996 Deliveries). This was a direct result of the need for technological enhancement required in compliance with stricter security protocols and efficient trade facilitation

The Corporation ended the second quarter of 2025 with improved financial results, including Earnings Before Interest, Taxes, Depreciation and Amortisation (EBITDA) of \$76.9 million (2024: \$64M), and Earnings Per Share (EPS) of \$1.31 (2024: \$1.04). We generated a Profit Before Tax (PBT) of \$62.5M, vs \$48.3M in 2024, and profit after tax of \$51.8M (2024: \$41.3M).

Strategic Outlook

As part of our commitment to enhancing value for all stakeholders, our diligent introspection identified the need for key initiatives which include investments in new technology, talent development, succession planning, infrastructural enhancements and the acquisition of port equipment. These measures will ensure improved operational efficiency and position the Corporation as global best in class status.

A New Era of Committed Leadership

The Leadership Team is committed to looking at the business closely with fresh perspectives and an unwayering focus on driving responsible performance. The collective expertise and proactive approach are already yielding tangible results, fostering a culture of accountability, sound governance, innovation, and continuous improvement. This new Leadership signifies a pivotal moment for the Corporation, ensuring that every decision is made with due care and a clear vision for the future.
