PLIPDECO's Ongoing Facilitation of Regional Humanitarian Efforts to Jamaica and Haiti

December 18th, 2025

PLIPDECO continues to actively support Trinidad and Tobago's humanitarian outreach to Jamaica and Haiti both of which were negatively impacted by Hurricane Melissa, through the coordinated handling and facilitation of essential relief supplies destined for these territories.

Under the leadership of Prime Minister the Honourable Kamla Persad-Bissessar, SC, MP, and in collaboration with the Honourable Jearlean John, Minister of Works and Infrastructure, Trinidad and Tobago Customs and Excise Division, Trinidad and Tobago Manufacturers' Association (TTMA), the Office of Disaster Preparedness and Management (ODPM), and other key stakeholders, the Port of Point Lisas will facilitate the shipment of seven (7) additional containers of humanitarian supplies to Jamaica on Saturday 20th December, 2025.

This latest shipment brings the total to twenty-five (25) containers of humanitarian aid facilitated through the Port of Point Lisas as part of wider regional relief efforts supporting both Jamaica and Haiti.
